The High Performance Program is focused on preparing and identifying the very best players in our province for future national program opportunities. The program will concentrate on exposing players to high level training programs including a focus on skill development, off-ice training and conditioning, and class sessions on many topics relevant to aspiring hockey players.

The following is a brief overview of the various staff positions available:

HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA HIGH PERFORANCE PROGRAM DIRECTOR, HOCKEY OPERATIONS

GENERAL: The Director of Hockey Operations will be required to attend all High Performance Program meetings, virtual meetings, camps and events as well as regular season tournaments and special events and play a pivotal role in the leadership and execution of the program

RESONSIBILITIES:

- to assist and coordinate the administration of program activities within the assigned age division within the High Performance Program
- to liaise with the High Performance Director to organize and coordinate scheduling of the High Performance Program
- to play a leading role in the annual identification and evaluation of players for the High Performance
- to attend all events and assist the with the administration of the annual program activities
- to assist with coordination and administration High Performance Program through the planning, scheduling, and other requirements necessary for each program
- to support all scheduled activities through ongoing coordination, monitoring and communication
- to participate in any conference calls hosted by Hockey Nova Scotia and/or the Hockey Canada related to the High Performance program

HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA HIGH PEROFMANCE PROGRAM HEAD COACH

GENERAL: The Head Coach shall be expected to attend all aspects of the High Performance Program including camps, virtual meetings and meetings and any requested by Hockey Nova Scotia. In addition, the Head Coach shall be expected to participate in all activities within each stage of the program. During all stages of the program, expenses will be covered for travel, meals and accommodations, if required.

RESPONSIBILTIES:

• to coordinate all planning activities and ensure that all staff members have a meaningful role in

- to assign specific roles during all games, practices, class sessions and team builders, to each staff member
- to plan, coordinate, attend and lead all practices within the defined program curriculum
- to plan, coordinate, attend and lead all class sessions within the defined program curriculum
- to interact directly with the General Manager on program activities, and problem solving
- to participate in all player evaluations
- to coordinate and lead the supervision of all camp participants including all wake- up calls, curfews, and room checks
- to plan and coordinate, in consultation with the General Manager all staff meetings and calls prior to and during program events and activities
- to assist camp registration and orientation as requested
- to abide by the High Performance Program Code of Conduct at all times
- to represent the program and Hockey Nova Scotia favourably at all times

HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM ASSISTANT COACH (2 Positions)

GENERAL: The Assistant Coach shall be expected to attend all aspects of the High Performance Program including camps, virtual calls and meetings and any requested by Hockey Nova Scotia. In addition, the Assistant Coach shall be expected to participate in all activities within each stage of the program. During all stages of the program, expenses will be covered for travel, meals and accommodations, if required

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- to assist the Head Coach with the coordination of all planning activities and ensure that all assigned roles are performed with the utmost professionalism
- to accept specific roles during all games, practices, class sessions and team builders, as assigned by the Director of Hockey Operations and the Head coach
- to assist with the planning and coordination of all practices as well as to actively participate in all
 practices using the plan developed within the defined program curriculum
- to assist with the planning and coordination of all class sessions as well as to actively participate
 in all sessions using the plan developed within the defined program curriculum
- to interact directly with the Head Coach and the General Manager on program activities, issues and problem solving
- to participate in all player evaluations
- to assist with the coordination and supervision of all camp participants including all wake- up calls, curfews, and room checks
- to participate in all staff meetings and conference calls prior to and during program events and activities
- to assist with camp registration and orientation as requested

HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA HIGH PERFOMANCE PROGRAM CAMP COACH

The camp coach position has been established to employ a qualified coach to assist the coaching staff to provide a superior developmental opportunity so that this individual can acquire knowledge and experience in the program and aspire to become a member of the program coaching staff in future years.

GENERAL: The Camp Coach shall be expected to attend all aspects of the High Performance Program including camps, virtual calls and meetings and any requested by Hockey Nova Scotia. In addition, the Head Coach shall be expected to participate in all activities within each stage of the program. During all stages of the program, expenses will be covered for travel, meals and accommodations, if required

Responsibilities:

- to assist the coaching staff with the coordination of all planning activities and ensure that all assigned roles are performed with the utmost professionalism;
- to actively participate in practices for assigned player group;
- to actively participate in all off-ice sessions for assigned player group;
- to manage the bench for the assigned player group during games preparing line combinations, defensive pairings and goaltender rotation, providing positive feedback to players;
- to assist with the player evaluation process by providing assessment of on ice performance as well as feedback from observations during games relating to player's behavior on bench and dressing rooms;
- to supervise assigned player group at all times (Hockey Development Festival only) ensuring that
 players are provided with proper guidance and direction. Ensures that any inappropriate behavior
 is referred to Head Coach and General Manager for corrective action.
- to assist with the coordination and daily supervision of all camp participants including all wake- up calls, curfews, and room checks
- to lead assigned player group during all activities ensuring that they are punctual and behave properly for all program activities;
- to participate in all staff meetings and conference calls prior to and during program events and activities;
- to assist with camp registration and orientation as requested;
- to abide by the High Performance Program Code of Conduct at all times;

HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM GOALIE COACH

GENERAL: The Goalie Coach shall be expected to attend all aspects of the High Performance Program including camps, virtual calls and meetings and any requested by Hockey Nova Scotia. In addition, the Goalie Coach shall be expected to participate in all activities within each stage of the program. During all stages of the program, expenses will be covered for travel, meals and accommodations, if required

- to accept specific roles during all games, practices, class sessions and team builders, as assigned by the General Manager and the Head coach
